Dr. Song's research focuses on the molecular and cellular mechanism of Alzheimer's disease and AD drug development. Weihong Song received his medical degree from Chongqing Medical University in 1983 and completed his psychiatry residency and research program with a Master of Medicine degree at West China University of Medical Sciences in 1986. He worked as a clinical psychiatrist and a Lecturer of Psychiatry at West China University of Medical Sciences. Dr. Song received a MSc in psychobiology from Purdue University in 1993 and a PhD in medical neurobiology and molecular genetics from the Department of Psychiatry at Indiana University School of Medicine. He did his postdoctoral training in the Department of Neurology at Harvard Medical School (1996-99), and then worked as an Instructor at Harvard Medical School (1999-2001). He joined UBC in 2001 and currently he is the Director of UBC Townsend Family Laboratories, and Jack Brown and Family Professor and Canada Research Chair in Alzheimer's Disease at UBC. He played an instrumental role in helping establishment of the China-Canada Joint Health Research Initiatives, a funding program jointly managed and funded annually by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) and the National Natural Science Foundation of China (NSFC) since 2006. In 2009 he was appointed by UBC as Special Advisor to the President on China. He serves as a member of the editorial board of Journal of Clinical Investigation and a Handling Editor of Journal of Neurochemistry.
