## Why Attend

- Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD) is a prevalent condition with a lifetime prevalence of 2 - 3% and clinicians should actively investigate its presence in patients with other mental conditions
- Patients with OCD and Obsessive Compulsive Spectrum Disorders (OCSDs) often have the first symptoms during childhood and adolescence: child psychiatrists, psychologists, pediatricians often represent the first contact
- OCSDs tend to be comorbid, chronic and very disabling. Duration of untreated illness
  occupies a great portion of the whole duration of illness.
- Comorbidity in OCSDs is associated with gender-related features and specific longitudinal trajectories
- Suicidal behaviours are not uncommon in OCSDs, particularly in comorbid subjects

#### Poor therapeutic response and treatment resistance are frequently encountered in OCSDs: optimization of guidelinesrecommended interventions can significantly improve patients' outcomes

As a result, there is an unprecedented need for advancing skills and understanding in the neuropsychopharmacology area of OCD and OCSDs
