



Max Hamilton Memorial Prize

Max Hamilton, M.D., F.R.C.P., F.R.C. Psych., D.P.M. (1912-1988) is best known for his assessment of depressive illness through psychometrics. The Hamilton Rating Scale for Depression is widely used throughout the world, and his 1960 paper on the problem of measuring the severity of depression is probably the most cited medical publication in the second half of the twentieth century. The recipient of the 2023 award will be chosen by an international scientific jury by February 2023. This prize consists of complimentary registration, travel support, three nights at the congress hotel and an engraved plaque to be presented at the 34th CINP Hybrid Congress taking place May 7-10, 2023, in Montréal, Canada.

- The Max Hamilton Memorial Prize is given to a young scientist in recognition of an outstanding contribution to psychopharmacology.
- Nominations can be made by any CINP members only; nominees need not be members of the CINP but must be 45 years old or younger on 31st December 2023.
- The contributions may be in clinical evaluation or services, in pre-clinical or clinical research, or any combination of these.
- The contributions may be empirical advances or a theoretical construct, based on a single discovery or a cumulative body of work.
- The Awardee must commit to attendance at the 2023 CINP World Congress.
