



Rafaelsen Young Investigators Award

In 1986 Ole Rafaelsen and William Bunney were instrumental in establishing a CINP programme supporting the attendance of young scientists at the XVth CINP Congress. That programme was posthumously named the Rafaelsen Fellowship Award to honour Dr. Rafaelsen, who died in 1987.

The recipients of the CINP 2024 World Congress Award will be chosen by an international scientific jury. Three awardees will be selected and presented with the award consisting of a certificate, three nights at the congress hotel, a USD 200 cash stipend and complimentary registration fee for the 2024 CINP World Congress in Tokyo, Japan. Selected recipients will also have the opportunity to present their abstract orally.

Guidelines:

- All applications must be sponsored by a CINP member.
- Applicants must be working within the area of neuropsychopharmacology and should have obtained a PhD or MD within the last 10 years prior to the last date of application.
- The applicant commits to participate with an oral presentation at the 2024 CINP World Congress if elected recipient of the award.
- In case an applicant is not elected recipient of one of the Rafaelsen Awards, he/she may elect to present the submitted work as an oral or poster in one of the regular sessions.
